Christ's Humility

Because of Jesus' humility, we have eternal life.

Isaiah 53:4-6

“Surely our griefs He Himself bore and our sorrows He carried; yet we ourselves esteemed Him stricken, smitten of God and afflicted. But He was pierced through for our transgressions, He was crushed for our iniquities; the chastening for our well-being fell upon Him, and by His scourging we are healed. All of us like sheep have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way; but the Lord has caused the iniquity of us all to fall on Him.”

Doesn't that just make us feel warm and fuzzy all over, that because of our self-seeking pleasures of all kinds, that God the Father sent His Son to the earth to suffer and die for us because we were too selfish to notice we were lost?

But, because Jesus did suffer and die and was resurrected, we have the hope of eternal life.

1Peter 1:3-5

“Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who according to His great mercy has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, to obtain an inheritance which is imperishable and undefiled and will not fade away, reserved in heaven for you, who are protected by the power of God through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time.”

Let's not forget Jesus humbled Himself even to the point of death for us, so we can have the hope and promise of eternal life.
