Each Lord's day, one of us men will stand behind this pulpit and express a thought, using Scripture, that pertains to the Lord's Supper.

I think it is important that we refresh our minds by reading the accounts that we have of the Lord's Supper.

Matt 26:17

Mark 14:12

Luke 22:7

Today I would like to read Paul's account from 1 Cor 11:23-26.

For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: The Lord Jesus, on the night He was

Betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you;

Do this in remembrance of Me." In the same way, after supper He took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new

Covenant in My blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of Me. For whenever you eat this

Bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until He comes."

In reading this passage of scripture, I observe that there is nothing complicated or difficult about this time of the Lord's Supper. As simple as it is, it has a very deep meaning. We, as Christians, open our minds to how precious a gift we have been given. This is not the way our society does things that are important.

They want a big production or show. But as children of our Heavenly Father, we partake of the bread and drink from the cup and remember how much it cost our Savior to give us this precious gift. We need to remember just how much we are loved by our Savior.

This passage is used a lot, but makes it no less meaningful. In the words of Paul "Thanks be to God, for His Indescribable gift"
