Will he look at us and say, “Come home with me, you look just like me”

How do we become dressed in righteousness, the righteousness of God?

2 Corinthians 5:21

He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.

Philippians 1:9-11

And this I pray, that our love may abound still more and more in real knowledge and all discernment, so that you may approve the things that are excellent, in order to be sincere and blameless until the day of Christ, having been filled with the fruit of righteousness which comes through Jesus Christ, to the glory and praise of God.

1 Peter 2:21-24

For you have been called for this purpose since Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example to follow in His steps, who committed no sin, nor was any deceit found in His mouth, and while being reviled He did not revile in return, while suffering, He uttered no threats, but kept entrusting Himself to Him who judges righteously, and He himself bore our sins in His body on the cross, so that we might die to sin and live to righteousness, for by His wounds you were healed.

When God looks at His children, he sees a people dressed in His righteousness, a people whose sins are covered, forgiven, by the blood of Jesus Christ.
